\* Jewish tradition teaches that in the diaspora, the Sabbatical days of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the Feast of Weeks, and the Feast of Tabernacles are lengthened by an extra day. Within the land of Israel, these days are traditionally celebrated as one day, and not as two. For example, the day referred to as “*Simchat Torah*” is celebrated within the land of Israel as part of the eighth day of the Feast of Tabernacles, but outside the land, it is celebrated on what ends up becoming a ninth day. The same holds true for the Feast of Weeks: within the land of Israel, it is a one day celebration, but outside of the land, it is traditionally kept for two days.

† It must be noted that the Books of Enoch, Baruch, and I Maccabees are part of the Apocrypha, and are not accepted as canonical by any modern sect of Judaism, nor by many Christian denominations. However, just as many authorities cherished them in antiquity, both Jewish and Christian, so do many within the Hebrew Roots Movement, both leaders and laymen, find value in them today.
